

With joyous shout - Welcome to the St David's Players 2013 production of The Mikado.

Set, to all intents and purposes, in Japan – but this is a fairy-tale Japan that is a thin veil for some very British satire, (the satire as relevant today as it was in 1885) – whilst the corruption personified in that illustrious official, Pooh-Bah, can be recognised as present in any government worldwide. Cash for questions, expenses scandals (duck houses!) – ring any bells?

A favourite of the Gilbert and Sullivan repertoire, The Mikado premiered on 14th March 1885 at the Savoy Theatre in London and ran for 672 performances. To remain a favourite for 128 years pays credit to the tunes – from sea shanty in Nanki-Poo's solo, through madrigals to imperial marching songs in the pentatonic scale depicting Japanese music styles – to say nothing of the usual Gilbertian plot and characters (self righteous Pooh Bah, conniving Katisha, and the innocent Yum-Yum). Tonight it is our turn and I hope you enjoy the performance.

I am delighted that this year we are supporting FORCE, the Exeter cancer charity. Please dig deep to support their raffle and bucket collections.

My thanks go to our director, Jane May and our musical director, Nicky Perry, who, supported by our backstage & technical crew, have created a fantastic show for you tonight. The cast have brushed up on their Japanese, including fan technique – so expect flawless execution tonight (there have been a few bruised toes in rehearsals!)

This year, I'd like to recognise the St David's Players committee, who, with Jane May and Nicky Perry, have made tonight's performance possible – thank you all for your contribution.

I am pleased to continue to welcome new members to the company – both on stage and off – and it's lovely to welcome back returning members.

I'd like to welcome audience members who are new to Gilbert & Sullivan, as well as loyal members of the audience. My thanks for your continued support of the Society.

The Mikado is particularly special to me as I met my husband on stage in my first production of the Mikado in Staines 12 years ago. The Mikado was also my first production with St David's Players when we moved to the West Country in 2004.

I hope you enjoy The Mikado as much as we do and you find it as enduring and endearing as I do.



Nicky's first involvement with St David's Players was as a school girl complete with wig and kimono in our 1981 production of The Mikado.




For the next nine years she was either in the pit playing the flute or the piano or taking time out to bring up three children.

解題 SUNDPSIS

The Mikado, or The Town of Titipu, is probably the most popular of the 14 comic operas written by WS Gilbert and Arthur Sullivan in the 25 years between 1871 and 1896. The work enjoys an enduring popularity that has seen it presented in many languages on many stages throughout the world, and to this day it is believed that on any day in the year, the opera is playing somewhere.

The piece opens in the courtyard of Ko-Ko's palace in the town of Titipu. A gathering of Japanese nobles is interrupted by the arrival of Nanki-Poo, a wandering musician (second trombone) who is in search of his beloved Yum-Yum. Some months ago as he was playing with the Titipu town band, their eyes met, and they fell in love. However, Yum-Yum was engaged to her guardian, Ko-Ko, a cheap tailor, and so Nanki-Poo left the town. Hearing that Ko-Ko had been condemned to death for the crime of flirting, Nanki-Poo has returned.

Nanki-Poo's hopes are dashed however, by Pish-Tush, who explains that in an effort to prevent anyone else from being beheaded, Ko-Ko has been raised to the post of Lord High Executioner, thus ensuring that no one else can be executed until Ko-Ko beheads himself. Pooh-Bah, the Lord High Everything-Else, after having received a considerable bribe, reinforces the point by telling Nanki-Poo that Ko-Ko is to wed Yum-Yum that very afternoon.

Ko-Ko arrives and consults Pooh-Bah about the details of his wedding. Their discussion is interrupted by the arrival of Yum-Yum, her friends Pitti-Sing and Peep-Bo, together with their school chums.

Yum-Yum is delighted to find that Nanki-Poo has returned, but is alarmed when he reveals that he is, in fact, the son of The Mikado, having fled his father's court and the unwanted attentions of the Katisha. In despair at the thought that Yum-Yum is to marry Ko-Ko, Nanki-Poo attempts suicide, but is persuaded by Ko-Ko to submit to execution at the hands of the public executioner in a months' time, provided that he can marry Yum-Yum in the interim. This will allow Ko-Ko to fulfil a decree received from the Mikado himself. However, the first act ends in confusion as Katisha arrives, recognises Nanki-Poo, and threatens to reveal his whereabouts to his father.

ct Two opens in Ko-Ko's garden A Spa, where Yum-Yum's friends are preparing her for her wedding to Nanki-Poo. The only drawback is the prospect that Nanki-Poo will be beheaded in a month's time, but a readjustment of the theory of time brings the lovers some relief.

Relief which is short lived however, as Ko-Ko reveals that he has discovered that by the Mikado's law, when a married man is beheaded, his wife is buried alive. An announcement that the Mikado is about to arrive prompts speedy and drastic action as Ko-Ko dispatches

Yum-Yum and Nanki-Poo to be married by the Archbishop of Titipu (Pooh-Bah), and then prepares to face the Mikado.

Ko-Ko aided by Pitti-Sing and the Titipu coroner (Pooh-Bah), gives a graphic account of the recent (fictitious) execution, only to get themselves deeper into trouble when Katisha reads the death certificate and discovers Nanki-Poo's name. The three conspirators are condemned to death by boiling in oil, the only concession being that this will take place after luncheon.

This delay gives Ko-Ko just enough time to woo Katisha and persuade her to marry him, this time before the registrar (again Pooh-Bah). When the Mikado reappears, all is resolved in truly Gilbertian manner; Nanki-Poo and Yum-Yum are able to come back to life and everyone (except, perhaps, Ko-Ko and Katisha) is happy!

the choir of St David's Church, Exeter, St David's Players' aim was to raise funds for the Biafran crisis. The first production (*Patience*) was such a success that it was decided to form a permanent company.

For the first couple of years the Society presented two productions a year, but since 1972, one main stage production a year has been normal.

During the years St David's Players havebuilt a formidable reputation for staging Gilbert and/or Sullivan productions to the highest possible standard, initially accompanied by two pianos, but since 1985, by an orchestra.

Over the past 43 years, the Society has produced all 14 Gilbert and Sullivan Operas at least once, and in many cases there have been multiple productions.

St David's Players have introduced Exeter, East and Mid Devon to the delights of Utopia (Limited), The Grand Duke, and also to a number of Sullivan's non-Gilbert works, including The Zoo, The Rose of Persia and The Emerald Isle. In 1999 the Society had the honour of being commissioned by the Arthur Sullivan Society to perform The

Emerald Isle at the International Gilbert and Sullivan Festival in Buxton, Derbyshire.

We rehearse in central Exeter from April to October each year with a performance at the end of that period. Rehearsals are great fun and we are always delighted to welcome new members both on stage as performers and off stage as helpers. We also arrange various social events throughout the year including trips to other productions by local companies.







We hope to see you there!


